# Weak quarter but a blip

Arvind reported a weak Q1FY25, after a strong showing in Q4FY24, driven by mainly the labour strike in Santej, which lasted 21 days. This impacted operation and the company could not fulfil some orders. Potential revenue/EBITDA loss was to the tune of INR2bn/600mn. The impact of the strike is one-off—a blip in the smooth running of operations. Despite this hit, management is confident of achieving the guided growth of double-digit revenue growth for the year driven by the AMD and Garments segments.

Factoring in the one-off impact (from strike), we are adjusting FY25E/26E revenue by -3/+1%; this along with a rollover to Q1FY27E yields a revised TP of INR431 (INR375 earlier) at 7.5x EV/EBITDA

### Growth takes a backstep amid strike; guidance unchanged

Textile revenue contracted 5% YoY/10% QoQ to INR13.5bn on account of a one-off labour strike in May-June. The strike lasted 21 days and was called off by the court. Overall, denim volumes contracted 3% YoY in Q1FY25. Meanwhile garment volumes posted robust volume growth of 25% YoY, but the ASP declined 18% YoY on account of changing product mix towards more of knitwear, which is more of a seasonal impact. Woven sub segment volumes also contracted 6% YoY. Current order book continues to show healthy demand. AMD revenue contracted 4% YoY. Management maintained the double-digit overall top-line growth for FY25 driven by 20%-plus growth in Advanced Materials Division on the back of robust demand.

### Margins suffer from loss of productive days, likely to bounce back

Overall EBITDA margin contracted 150bp YoY/350bp QoQ driven by the loss of productive hours due to strike of 21 days in Santej. The company is taking steps to address worker grievances, improve communication and increase automation to reduce labour dependency. The monetary impact of strike in the form of potential revenue/EBITDA for the company was INR2bn/60mn. Management did point out that orders could not be fulfilled amid the strike.

### Key takeaways from conference call

i) EBITDA margin has the dual impact of low productivity due to strike plus elections, and also there is increased cost of air freight of about INR110mn to ensure timely deliveries. ii) Guidance of double-digit growth maintained for FY25. AMD at 20% plus growth plus Textile in early double-digits. iii) The company reduced gross debt by INR550mn. iv) The AMD segment aims to achieve 20%+ growth and potentially reach INR20bn in a couple of years.

# Q1FY25 conference call highlights

### **Q1FY25**

- EBITDA margin has dual impact of low productivity due to strike plus elections and there was an increased cost of airfreight of about INR110mn to ensure timely deliveries.
- Strike had an impact of INR2bn in Revenue and INR600mn in EBITDA.
- Company reduced gross debt by INR550mn
- Currently Bangladesh situation does not have much impact on the company.
- For higher volume growth, the reason was change in product mix, the full garment knit business witnessed strong growth.
- Capacity of garmenting business is around 45mn pieces
- The strike was called illegal by the court as the union was not taken in confidence before calling in the strike.
- Employee expenses were lower as there are many variable benefits attached to the salary, which are paid out only after achieving the agreed budgeted output.
- Guidance of double-digit growth maintained for FY25. AMD at 20% plus growth plus Textile in early double digits.
- The shift towards knitwear impacted realizations in the garment segment, but this is expected to normalize over time.
- The company is taking steps to address worker grievances, improve communication, and increase automation to reduce labor dependency.
- The garment segment is expected to be the primary driver of overall growth for the textile business

### **AMD** business

- Strong growth in new verticals: Mobility solutions and defense segments within AMD are experiencing significant growth, with defense expected to cross INR 200 crore.
- Focus on deeper customer relationships: AMD is focusing on increasing its share of wallet with existing large customers.
- **New product capabilities:** The addition of new product capabilities like monofilament and PTFE phase is expected to contribute to revenue growth in the second half of the year.
- Growth target: AMD aims to achieve 20%+ growth and potentially reach INR 2000 crore in a couple of years.

### Outlook

- Capex guidance maintained at INR4-4.5bn for FY25
- 140 retail stores currently, 40-50 store additions in guidance.
- Annualised- volume growth guidance of 25% for garments sub segment is maintained.

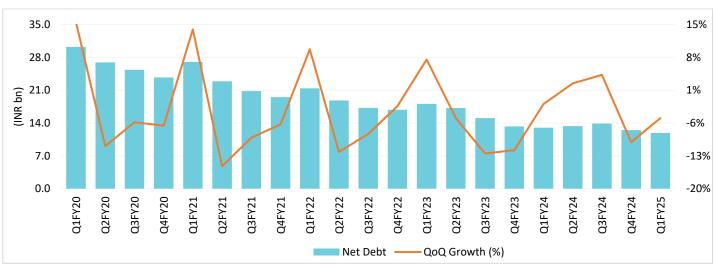
- Towards second half shall cross 10mn in volumes on a quarterly basis from the current 9mn in Garments.
- Debt will remain in the range of +-10% of FY24.
- The company aims to increase garmenting capacity from 45 million to 60 million.
- The company maintains a positive outlook for the remaining quarters due to strong demand and order book.

## **ARVIND**

### **Company Description**

Incorporated in 1931, Arvind Ltd, is the largest textile company in India and is a part of the Lalbhai group. Arvind was the pioneer in the denim space in India and entered the export market for Denims in 1987-88. Currently it is the leader in the denim manufacturing space and supplies to customers like GAP, Lee, Wrangler, Levi's etc. Apart from denim, the company has also emerged as a leading manufacturer in the woven space (with customers like Madura Garments, Marks & Spencers etc.) and is now enhancing its presence in the garmenting segment (which has customers like GAP, Tommy Hilfiger, Calvin Klein etc.).

### **Investment Theme**

Mature textile business to provide base for growth: Arvind is the largest cotton textile manufacturer in India. With capacity of 108mn meters, it is one of the largest denim manufacturers globally. Similarly, it is the leader in the woven segment in India and is also scaling up garmenting capacities to forge an integrated business model. Along with calibrated capacity addition, the company is steadily focussing on value addition.

### **Key Risks**

Raw materials, mainly cotton/cotton yarn, constitute ~45% of the company's overall cost base. Any significant increase in raw material prices (FY11 saw spike in cotton prices) can adversely impact Arvind's profitability

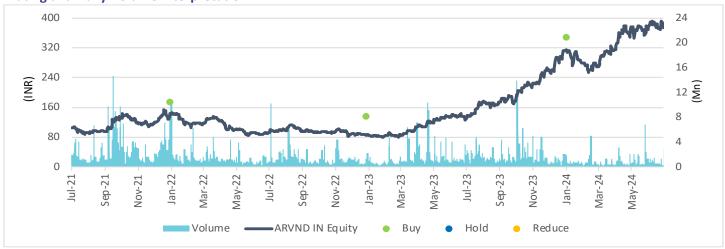
