Yet another strong quarter

Ambuja Cement (ACEM) delivered ~20% YoY consolidated volume growth in Q1FY26 (13% YoY excluding acquisitions) while realisation improved 2% QoQ, taking EBITDA/t to INR1,066 (up 27% YoY/4% QoQ). Its total cement capacity stands at ~105MnT; management reiterated their goal of 118/140mtpa in capacity by end-FY26E/FY28E. ACEM expects 7-8% industry volume growth in FY26E. It has achieved cost savings to the tune of INR175-200/t against a target of INR530/t by FY28E. Capex for FY26E is likely to be ~INR100bn.

We are calibrating estimates considering better volumes and pricing in the industry. Retain 'BUY' with a revised TP of INR745 (earlier INR694) based on 20x Q1FY28E EV/EBITDA.

Outperforms industry on volumes; realisation improves sequentially

ACEM's Q1FY26 EBITDA at ~INR19.61bn (highest quarterly ever) beat consensus estimate by ~3%. Highlights: i) Volumes shot up ~20% YoY (up ~1% QoQ) to 18.4MT highest quarterly volumes ever; adjusted for acquisitions, volume growth was ~13% YoY. Realisation improved ~2% YoY/QoQ due to price hikes taken primarily in southern and eastern regions EBITDA/t came in at INR1,066 (up ~27% YoY/~4% YoY/QoQ). As per management, INR175-200/t cost savings have already been achieved against targeted cost savings of INR530/t by FY28E through efficiency measures. They expect industry volumes to grow 7-8% in FY26E (earlier estimate of 6-7%), and reckon 75-78% capacity utilisation for the company in FY26E.

Capex programme on track

Consolidated cement capacity of the group stands at ~105mtpa with a goal to reach 118/140mtpa by FY26E/FY28E (refer to exhibit 9). Beyond FY26E, the company will focus on achieving a better regional mix of capacities (refer to exhibit 10) with emphasis on the north and central regions. ACEM commissioned 57MW wind power in Q1FY26, taking its renewable capacity to 473MW. Green power share is expected to reach 60% by FY28E from existing ~28%, which will help in reducing power cost from INR5.9/kWh to INR4.5/kWh. Capex guidance for FY26E stands at ~INR100bn (including acquisition-related payments). As per management, ACEM's consolidated market share has increased by 200bp to 15.5%.

Healthy balance sheet to fund capex programme

ACEM (consolidated) remains debt free with cash/cash equivalents of ~INR30bn and a net worth of INR~664bn. The capex program to reach the target of 140MT by FY28E will be funded via internal accruals.

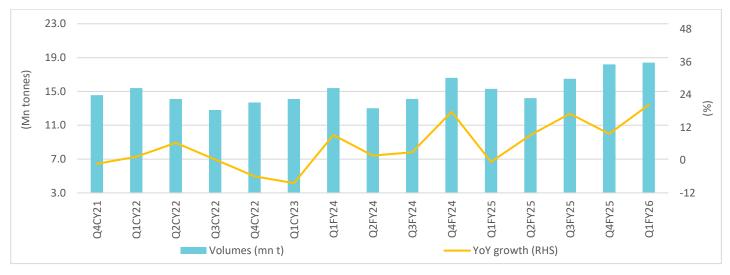

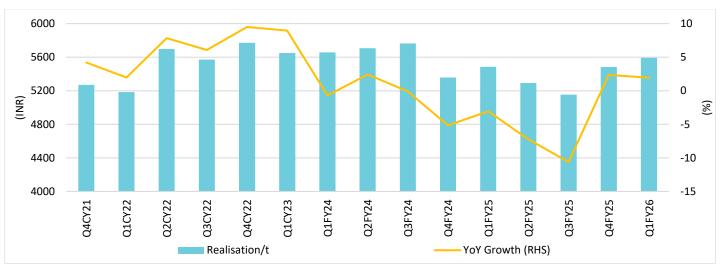

Exhibit 4: Realisation up ~2% YoY

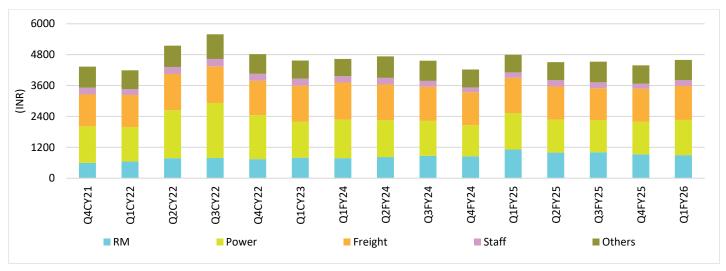

Exhibit 5: Blended realisation versus EBITDA/t

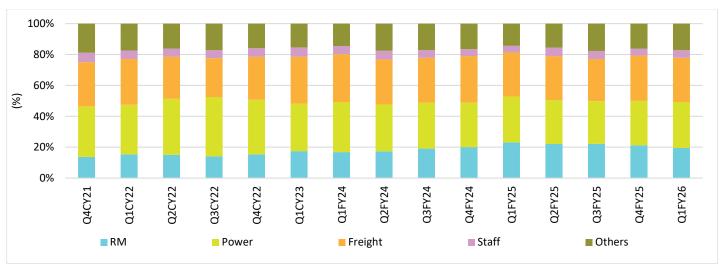


Exhibit 6: Opex cost split (absolute terms)

Exhibit 8: Spread/t rises ~8% YoY

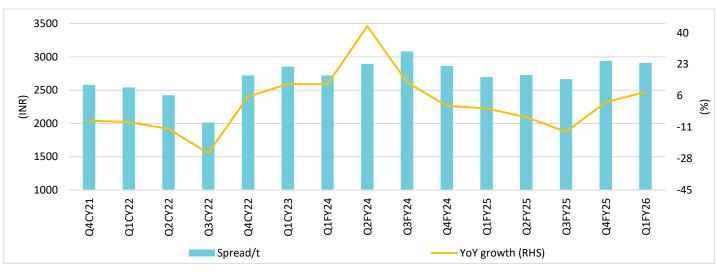
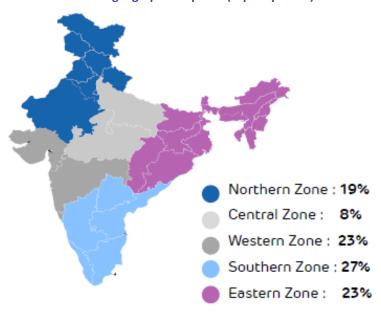

Outlook

Management indicated that industry volumes grew $^{\sim}4\%$ YoY in Q1FY26. In contrast, Ambuja's consolidated volumes rose 13% YoY organically. Management expects industry volumes to grow 7–8% in FY26E (revised up from initial expectations of 6–7% growth).

Realisations improved sequentially due to prices hikes taken primarily in the southern and eastern regions.

Total capex for FY26 will be ~INR100bn.

Orient Cement

Orient Cement has become a subsidiary w.e.f. 22nd Apr-25. The primary focus of management in FY26E is to improve the overall efficiency at Orient Cement and then it will emphasise on expansion plans, viz., Chittapur, Devapur, MP, etc. in FY27E.

Cost/t trajectory

Power & fuel cost/t decreased 4% YoY (up ~8% QoQ), freight cost/t decreased ~4% YoY (up ~3% QoQ), other expenses/t increased ~14% YoY (up ~11% QoQ) and raw material cost/t decreased ~14% YoY (down ~17% QoQ).

Other updates

Management believes the outlook is **positive on the pricing front**. ACEM has increased prices in its premium segment.

It reiterated the aim to reach EBITDA/t of INR1,500 by FY28E.

Cost reduction of INR175–200/t has already been achieved by the company.

Market share stood at 15.5% (up 200bp YoY).

Kiln fuel cost reduced to INR1.59/kcal YoY from INR1.74/kcal.

Currently, it has 105MnT cement capacity and 64MnT clinker capacity.

Trade share stood at 74%. **Premium share** accounted for 33% of trade sales—among the highest in the industry.

The company commissioned 57MW wind power in Q1FY26, thereby taking its renewable capacity to 473MW. **Green power** stood at 28.1% and the aim is to reach 60% by FY28E. This will reduce existing cost of INR5.9/kWh to INR4.5/kWh by FY28E.

Primary lead distance stood at 269km and is expected to further reduce by ~50km (FY28E). This will help reduce logistic cost by INR150/t.

Cash & cash equivalents stood at INR30bn. Consolidated **net worth** stood at INR~664bn.

Company Description

Ambuja Cements Limited is among India's leading cement companies. ACEM (consol) has a capacity of ~105 mtpa. The company has launched innovative products like Ambuja Plus, Ambuja Cool Walls, Ambuja Compocem and Ambuja Kawach etc. Adani Group acquired ~63.2% stake in the company from the Holcim Group in July'22. ACEM also holds a controlling 50.05% stake in ACC

Investment Theme

ACEM has one of the strongest balance Sheet and one of the highest ROEs in the Indian cement space. Adani group has ambitious plans to double the combined capacity of ACC and Ambuja Cement to ~140 mtpa by FY28 and emerge as the most efficient and profitable player in the country by 2030. We recommend BUY with TP of INR 745.
